Chip Gilbert ran a solo trip to Chestnut Ridge Heritage Preserve in northern Greenville County on May 2, while many club members were attending the Carolina Bird Club meeting in Clemson. High winds kept the species list down slightly from scouting in the same area on Thursday, as the wind made it tough to spot movement. A Gray-cheeked Thrush hanging out with a Wood Thrush gave some very good looks, as did a male Hooded Warbler. Before heading up, at 7:00 AM in the Lake Cunningham parking lot an American Robin, Wood Ducks, Red-winged Blackbirds, Common Grackles and Canada Geese were present.
